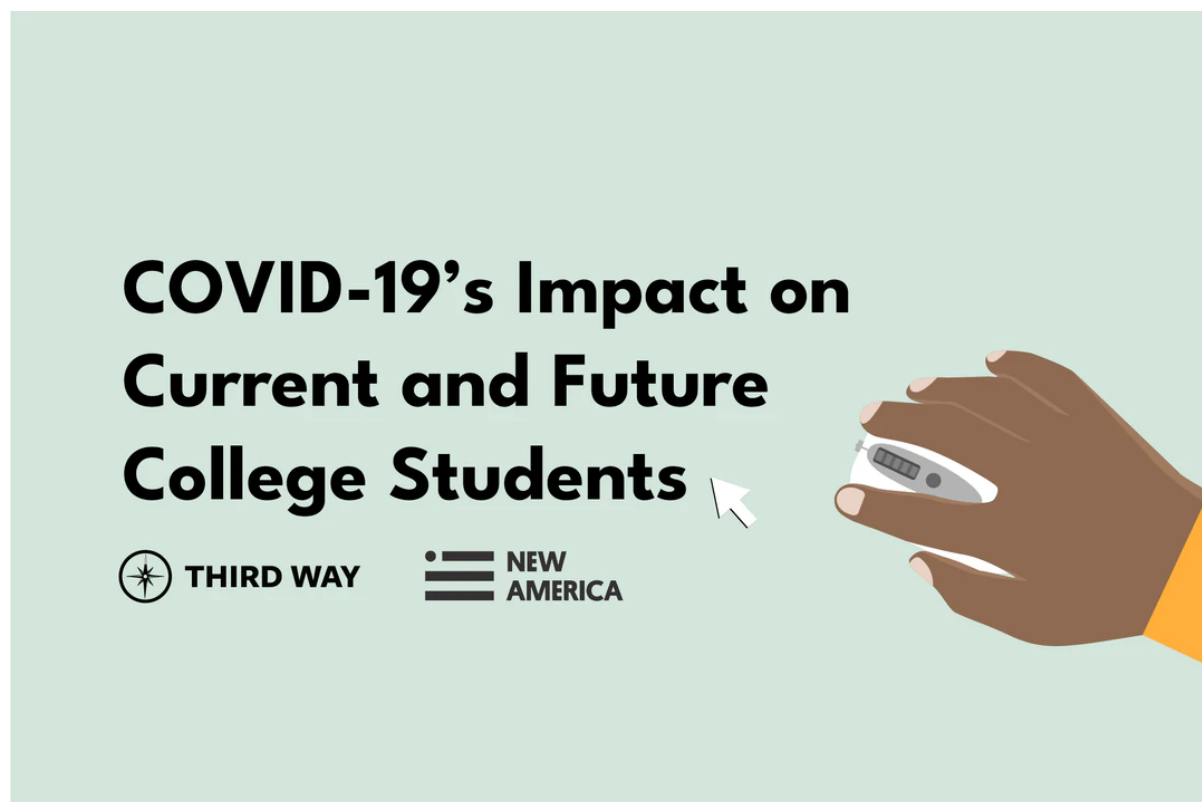


COVID-19's Impact on Latinx Students

Recent polling by Third Way & New America finds that Latinx college students have different concerns and challenges than other student groups when it comes to how COVID-19 has, and will continue to, shape their student experience.

Students Have Faced Challenges Continuing Their Education

47% say having enough resources to pay for school is a big challenge vs. **37%** overall

39% found it difficult to find a quiet place to study vs. **29%** overall

52% say inability to access labs etc. has been a big challenge

Concerned With COVID-19 Spreading to Family & Friends

66% say their friends and family catching COVID-19 is a significant concern vs. **56%** overall

61% are concerned with catching COVID-19 and spreading it to others vs. **52%** overall

Less Optimistic About Graduating & Higher Ed in General

22% say this crisis will result in them taking longer to complete their degree vs. **14%** overall

73% believe colleges are prioritizing their bottom lines over the health of students

54% believe college isn't worth the cost anymore

Global Strategy Group conducted an online survey August 6–17, 2020 of 1,407 college students nationwide, including oversamples of 223 caregivers, 253 Black students, and 311 Latinx students. The survey also included 211 high school seniors nationwide.



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
