May 28, 2020 | 12:30-1:30 PM



Climate and the 2020 Campaign

On Thursday, July 1 we held a panel discussion to highlight these issues and potential solutions, and find out what it meant for Election 2020. **Nathaniel Smith**, Founder and Chief Equity Officer of Partnership for Southern Equity, talked with **Julia Pyper** from *Greentech Media* and the Political Climate podcast on solutions to urgently and equitably address the twin challenges of COVID-19 and climate change during the most critical election cycle yet. Afterward, **Rep. Stephanie Murphy (D-FL)**, Wisconsin **Lieutenant Governor Mandela Barnes** (NewDEAL Forum Climate Policy Group Co-Chair), Philadelphia City **Councilman Derek Green** (NewDEAL Leader), and Executive Director of Michigan's League of Conservation Voters **Lisa Wozniak** joined for a conversation moderated by Monica Medina from *Our Daily Planet* on how swing state leaders are preparing for the election and shock proofing their states for these crises. The event closed with a special fireside chat that Josh Freed, Senior Vice President of Third Way's Climate and Energy Program, moderated with **Mayor Pete Buttigieg**, former Democratic presidential candidate, NewDEAL Leader, and Mayor of South Bend, Indiana, on lessons from the campaign trail.
