The Department of Education gives institutions of higher education more than \$150 billion of federal student financial aid each year under Title IV of the Higher Education Act. In an attempt to provide quality assurance and prevent fly-by-night operations from gaming the system and ripping off students, the government relies on private accrediting agencies to determine which institutions are eligible.

But the current system of 37 different accrediting agencies responsible for overseeing over 7,500 institutions sorts wildly diverse schools unpredictably between national, regional, and specialized agencies. Can this jumbled accreditation process really provide a high standard of quality assurance for the millions of students who take out student loans every year?
