Source: Across-the-board spending reductions of \$880 billion in Medicaid would equate to an 10.89% total Medicaid cut. Hospital spending accounts for one-third of total Medicaid spending so, of the 10.89% cut, 3.63% would apply to hospitals. Authors used the National Academy for State Health Policy's Hospital Cost Tool (<https://tool.nashp.org/>) to assess individual hospital revenues from Medicaid. These revenues were then multiplied by the expected 3.63% Medicaid cut to provide the impact for specific hospitals.



THIRD WAY
