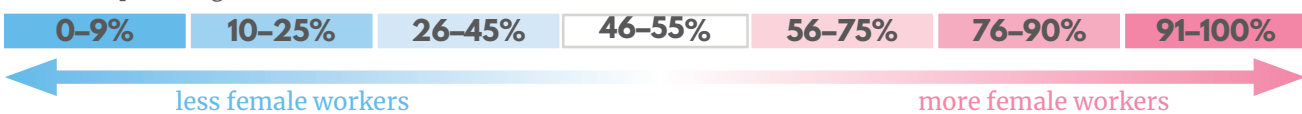


... While 14 of the 20 Jobs in the Bottom Earnings Decile Were Female-Dominated
